## HOW TO OBTAIN A BUILDING PERMIT FOR A FLOOD DAMAGED STRUCTURE

[Be aware that a building permit is not required to remove damaged dry wall (sheetrock) from the walls or ceiling inside a flood damaged structure.]

- 1. Fill out completely an application for a building permit at the Building & Planning Department located at 819 South Street.
- 2. Depending on the location of the damaged structure, the Permit Technician will determine if the structure is located in a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) or outside the SFHA.
- 3. If the structure is located outside the SFHA the owner or the owner's agent can obtain a building permit and proceed with the repairs. Remember that the owner or contractor must call for the required inspections. A list of the required inspections are available at the Building & Planning Department and can be picked up at the time of issuance of the permit.
- 4. If the structure is located inside the SFHA, the Building & Planning Department will perform a damage assessment survey and determine if the structure has been substantially damaged.
- Substantial damage is a structure that is damaged so that the cost of restoring it to its predamaged condition would equal or exceed 50% of the market value (the building value excluding the land).
- Market Value can be established by an independent certified appraisal, replacement cost depreciated by age of building-actual cash value or adjusted assessed values.
- 5. If the structure is less than 50% substantially damaged, the property owner or the owners agent can receive a building permit and make the necessary repairs to the structure.
- 6. If the structure is 50% or greater substantially damaged, the structure must comply with the City's Floodplain Damage Prevention Ordinance. The property owner must decide on one of the following:
  - a) Relocate the structure outside of the SFHA.
  - b) Elevate the structure to the Base Flood Elevation (BFE) plus 2 feet.
  - c) Demolish the structure.
- 7. If the structure is determined to be substantially damaged and the property owner wishes to

occupy the structure without complying with any of the measures mentioned above in #6, the owner may consider signing a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the City of Vicksburg.

- 8. Contact the Building & Planning Department at 601-634-4528 should you have any questions concerning the permit and inspection process.
- 9. All structures that have been inundated by the flood waters will need to be inspected before utilities can be released.
- 10. Those structures in which the electrical systems was under water will need to be inspected by a licensed electrician before the electricity will be released. The use of a temporary power pole may be required during the reconstruction phase if the electrical system is unable to pass inspection.
- 11. Those structures in which the gas piping system was under water will need to be purged and tested by a licensed plumber before the gas will be released.
